CALIFORNIA ENERGY COMMISSION Administered ARRA-Funded Programs (\$314.5 million)

State Energy Program (SEP) – \$226 million

• SEP Energy Efficiency Program: \$110 million

Program: *Energy Efficiency Program*. Aimed at promoting economic vitality and building a clean energy workforce, this program focuses on energy efficiency measures for residential and commercial building retrofits and installing on-site photovoltaic systems. Funds are awarded in three areas: Residential Building Retrofit, Municipal and Commercial Building Retrofit and the Municipal Financing Program.

- SEP Clean Energy Business Financing Program: \$30.6 million Program: Clean Energy Business Financing Program. Focus is on industry job-creation and retention by providing low interest loans to private companies that will retool, improve, modify or expand renewable product manufacturing facilities.
- Department of General Services (DGS): \$25 million
 Program: Energy Efficient State Property Revolving Loan Program. The revolving loan program allows state agencies to install energy efficient projects on state-owned property and repays loans from the energy savings.
- SEP/Energy Conservation Assistance Account (ECAA): \$25 million Program: 1% Energy Efficiency Loans. Local jurisdictions were encouraged to combine block grants or SEP funding with a low interest loan to invest in energy efficiency, save money, reduce green house gas emissions and build new jobs and industries for their communities.
- Employment Development Department (EDD) and Employment Training Panel (ETP): \$20 million Program: SEP Clean Energy Workforce Training Program. The nation's largest state-sponsored clean energy workforce training program is focused on providing training for employment in the energy and water efficiency, renewable energy, smart-grid and clean transportation fields.

Contracts and Program Support: \$15.4 million
 Audit, measurement and evaluation contracts for ARRA-funded programs and projects; and administration and
 program support. Notice of Proposed Awards in February 2010. Monitoring, Verification and Evaluation
 contract approved March 24, 2010.

Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant Program – \$49.6 million

• Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grants (EECBG): \$46 million

Program: Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grants. A minimum of 60 percent of these funds will go to California's eligible small cities and counties on a per capita basis for local governments to invest in cost-effective energy efficient products and/or projects for their communities.

• Contracts and Program Support: \$3.6 million Audit, measurement and evaluation contracts for ARRA-funded programs and projects; and administration and program support.

State Energy Efficient Appliance Rebate Program (CA Cash for Appliances) – \$35.2 million

• Appliance Rebates: \$33.7 million

Program: *Energy Efficient Appliance Rebate Program*. California consumers will be able to use an ARRA rebate when purchasing Energy Star clothes washers (\$100), refrigerators (\$200) and room air conditioners (up to \$50). This incentive can also be combined with any utility and manufacturer rebate.

• **Contracts:** Up to \$1.5 million

Private rebate processing center contracted to valid and process consumer rebate forms. Request for Proposal released January 2010, and contract complete April 2010. California State Controller's Office to issue rebates.

Security-Related Energy Assurance Planning – \$3.6 million
